



Highlights of our in-home program include:

Early Intervention

Children are taught skills quickly and efficiently.

Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)

Children are taught to complete essential skills such as brushing teeth and toilet training.

Communication

Children are taught skills necessary to communicate verbally with others.

School Consultation

Clinical supervisors observe in classrooms, consult with school staff and provide support with the IEP (individualized educational program) process.

Community Programs

Children are taught generalization of skills to the natural environment.

Families work with their clinicians as part of their child's clinical team.
